Video tricks — Close examination of the video and finding the original video are among the lessons here.</li> <li>3. Twisting Facts — Watch for deceptive headlines, opinions presented as facts, distortions, made-up facts and neglected details.</li> <li>4. Pseudo-Experts, Imagined Experts and Misrepresented Experts — How to check their credentials and their statements.</li> <li>5.
