<b>Topic:</b>	Digital Content Creation
<b>Title:</b>	Where to create a Blog
<b>Time:</b>	It will take you about 1 hour to explore the websites.
<b>Type of Resource:</b>	Platforms for creating a Blog
<b>Content of the Resource</b>	<p>A blog is very similar to a website, even though it is simpler to use. They have a diary/journal structure, and those who maintain the blog (also known as bloggers) update information quite often. Blogs often revolve around a specific theme: for instance, if your class or school is carrying out a specific project, the blog can be a journal of the steps of the projects, and the pupils can cure themselves the contents to be published. Since the blog is organized as a diary/journal, when the pupils publish some content, they organize it inside a specific post. We can think of a post as an article. The posts are organized in a reverse chronological order, meaning that the most recent post appears first.</p> <p>Here a short list of platforms that are specifically designed for blog creation.</p> <p>Please note that when a platform for website or blog creation are for free, it means that the users have limited access to all the options that the platform offers. Moreover, the website or blog has much less visibility, as it does not appear by a simple search on a search engine (e.g. Google).</p>
