### Development and Evaluation of the Digital Citizenship Programme and Curricula on digital literacy

The DRC project's consortium has successfully completed its 4<sup>th</sup> output, the "Development and Evaluation of the Digital Citizenship Programme and Curricula on digital literacy". The Digital Citizenship Programme is an interactive curriculum on digital literacy with practical tips, pedagogical tools, methods, resources and material for teachers and students. It is comprised of a user's guide to help teachers, school librarians, instructional designers, educational authorities, policymakers, and trainers to support others interested in engaging with the content of the project. The curricula will be implemented through a 5-week long program that will introduce students to necessary ICT skills through hands-on experience and interactive virtual games.
